- Use strategies for monitoring and adjusting to maintain vertical alignment over time.

Engaging with First Nations Rightsholders and Indigenous Partners is offered in conjunction with the Ministry's Indigenous Education branch and provides an opportunity for Superintendents, Assistant Superintendents, and/or Secretary Treasurers to explore topics such as Indigenous Education Councils.

Outcomes:

 Increase capacity to work together with First Nations Rightsholders and Indigenous partners through an understanding of the purpose, role, and function of Indigenous Education Councils in the continuous improvement process

Purpose:

Exploring Strategic Engagement provides a venue for district leaders to explore engagement strategies that amplify multiple perspectives and actively shape district planning beyond strategic plan creation. Districts will aim to improve equity of outcomes for all learners by effectively bringing communities into the student learning conversation.

Outcomes:

- Create an effective plan for meaningful, ongoing, strategic engagement focused on student learning.
- Utilize various engagement levels, tools, and techniques to build and maintain relationships with First Nations Rightsholders and Indigenous partners, students, parents/caregivers, education partners, and community members.

Effective Strategic Planning

Effective Strategic Planning is for districts preparing to create a new strategic plan. By exploring components of an effective strategic planning process, participants will lay a foundation for the continuous improvement of learning outcomes during the next 3-5 years.
