Questions and Answers: Healthy Schools BC Website Transition to HealthLink BC

1. Why is the Healthy Schools BC (HSBC) website moving to HealthLink BC?

- Starting today, the HSBC website will be hosted and maintained by HealthLink BC under the Ministry of Health. It will now be easier to access provincial school health promotion information and resources under one location alongside other evidence-based health information currently located on HealthLink BC.

2. What has changed with the HSBC website?

- While the HSBC website has moved, you will still be able to find most of the information and resources at the new location on HealthLink BC. Some initial improvements we've made include updates to where the content and resources are located within the site to increase ease of access and reduce duplication of information.

3. What do I need to do?

- If you had the HSBC website URL bookmarked (<https://healthyschoolsbc.ca/>), you will be automatically redirected to the new HSBC landing page on HealthLink BC for the next few months.
