Since 2018-2019, Boards of Education and First Nations have been asked to work together to determine First Nation Student transportation needs and to co-develop Joint First Nations Student Transportation Plans (“Joint Plans”). As we enter the eighth year of implementation of this model, the central purpose of this gathering is to discuss updates related to First Nations Students’ transportation needs and answer questions for the 2026-2027 school year. Effective working relationships and collaboration between First Nations and local school districts is crucial to finding safe and reliable solutions to the transportation needs of First Nations Students in B.C.’s public school system.
